-  What tips or tricks have you picked up from your job / jobs?

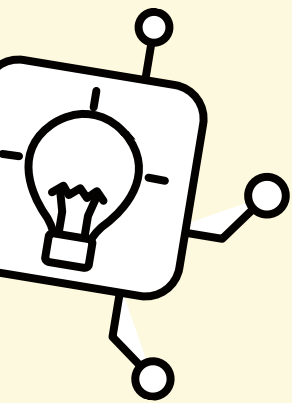


Graphic Recording in 4 Steps



STEP 1: GATHER SUPPLIES

- Get one sheet of paper (ideally blank), a pencil, a black marker, and a coloured marker of your choice.



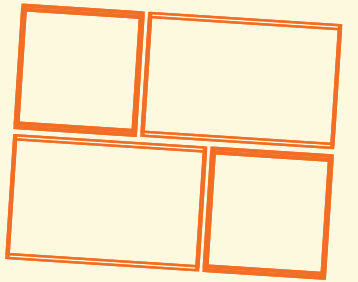
STEP 2: THINK ABOUT YOUR TIMING

- Each person gets 6 minutes (talk/visualize) before switching.

Tips:

- Try and fill half your page by the halfway mark (3 mins)
- Speak clearly, don't rush!

STEP 3: ORGANIZE YOUR PAPER



- Create your title first before your partner starts.
- Think about the objective. Is it to tell a story?
- Go from left to right. Are you answering several questions? Write the questions out first and record around them.

STEP 4: LISTEN



Tips:

- Bigger images and text = key point.
- Draw in pencil if you're not sure it's relevant yet.
- Don't worry about the images! Draw only if it comes easily.
- Ask clarifying questions.
